## **OUR LADY OF SORROWS**

To try and forget ourselves in a crisis we turn to prayer and to Mary, our Mother in heaven. If anyone is able to console us and share our grief it is she. For Mary is the Mother of God and is all-powerful. Further, she is the mother of each one of us, for Our Lord gave her to me and to you from His Cross.
