Feast Day for the Legal Protection of the Unborn

January 22nd was chosen for the day because it is the day that U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion in 1973. In 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade, but pre-born children are still threatened in many states.
